### THE 7 LAST DAYS OF JESUS' LIFE

### Saturday

What would you do if you only had seven days to live? What are the most important things you can do? Jesus faced this situation as he arrived in the area of Jerusalem before his last Passover. So, my goal is to find out what he did every day during his last week on the earth.

Jesus had just visited Jericho, where he stayed with Zaccheus. On the Saturday before Passover Jesus traveled to Jerusalem for the last time. On the way he paused to heal a blind man named Bartimaeus before he continued the ascent to Jerusalem.

The trip from Jericho to Jerusalem was not an easy journey. The road during New Testament times was eighteen miles long and climbed from Jericho (820 feet below sea level) to Jerusalem (2474 feet above sea level). So that you might have a better understanding of this rise lets consider Raton Pass, on I-25, between Raton, New Mexico and Trinidad, Colorado. The elevation of Raton, New Mexico, is 6680 feet above sea level. The top of Raton Pass, ten miles north, has an elevation of 7835 feet above sea level. So, in ten miles I-25 rises 1155 feet. Having driven that stretch of highway numerous times under various conditions I can say that under the best conditions it would be a difficult walk. By comparison, the road from Jericho to Jerusalem is eight miles longer but rises an additional 2400 feet. That is like climbing a 12 ½ story building every mile. It makes me breathless just thinking about it.

Most sources agree that a healthy person can walk twenty miles a day. So, Jesus probably traversed the distance in a day. That said, I am not surprised that we find Jesus resting in Bethany after a long

day's trek. The gospels differ about which house he was in. Matthew and Mark relate that it was in the home of Simon the Leper (Matthew 26:6-13 and Mark 14:3-9), while John records that it was in the home of Lazarus (John 12:1-11). Matthew and Mark don 't identify the woman; however, John lets the cat out of the bag. It was Mary, the sister of Lazarus. There are other differences. For instance, John and Mark point out that the price of the perfume was three hundred denarii, but John leaves out the price. Also, Mark and Matthew inform us that the perfume was in an alabaster container and that it was poured on the head, while John remembers that it was poured on the feet. Finally, Matthew and Mark say the apostles were arguing about the price of the perfume, but John zeros in on Judas. One would think they were recording two different accounts except for one important thing. All three recount the apostle's objection to cost of the perfume, and Jesus telling them that her act was preparing his body for burial. Ominous. After this there is no more discussion.

Maybe, whose house, or the head or feet is not the important thing here. Jesus had just walked uphill for eighteen miles toward the cross. As he laid his head on a cushion that night his mind replayed not only the lessons and miracles of the day, he thought of every uttered word for the last three years. He had served his father well, but he was not done. One more week. One day at a time.


