THE 7 LAST DAYS OF JESUS' LIFE

Day 2 in the series

Sunday

When we consider the last week of Jesus' life we are confronted with one huge challenge. The Jewish day doesn't begin at 12:00 midnight. The Jewish day begins at sundown which is confusing because the time of sundown changes. For instance, sundown on December 21st in Fort Worth is 5:27 PM, while sundown on June 21st is 8:41 PM. This issue is important because the Passover is an evening meal, which means it is the first meal of the day. So, Passover for us is on Thursday evening. But for the Jewish people during Jesus's day, it was first meal on Friday.

So, when Jesus woke up on Sunday morning it was the middle of the day. That is to say, he had about 12 hours before Monday. He probably ate breakfast at Lazarus's home in Bethany and then began to plan out his day.

His plan for his last week seems to have been to poke the beast. The beast was the religious establishment. The office of High Priest had been bought and sold since the time of the Maccabees, and Sadducees and Pharisees were embroiled in a political battle for the support of the common people and Rome. The result was that the religious establishment had ceased to be the spiritual leaders that the nation desperately needed.

On Sunday Jesus would go to the temple for the first time that week and he would poke the beast. Bethany was about two miles from Jerusalem, but this trip would not be a simple walk. To poke the beast it had to be special. Jesus chose to fulfill Zechariah 9:9, where Zechariah prophecies that Jerusalem's king would enter the city on a colt. At Bethphage, about a mile from Jerusalem Jesus sent two apostles to get a colt/donkey that had never been ridden. This was accomplished by telling the owner that "the Lord had need of it." Apparently a crowd had been gathering because it was known that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem and that he had raised Lazarus from the dead. The air was electric and Jesus was the spark. The

apostles put garments on the back of the colt and began the descent from the Bethphage to Jerusalem. At this time the multitudes placed their outer garments or palm branches on the road in front of him and cried, "Hosanna to the Son of David; Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest." This unrehearsed response to Jesus was from Psalms 118:26 and it poked the beast. Luke records two things that the other gospels leave out. The first is that the Pharisees wanted Jesus to "rebuke" his disciples, but Jesus replied that if the disciples were silent the stones would cry out. The second is that Jesus cried because of the future destruction of Jerusalem.

The gospels tell us that Jesus reached Jerusalem. Matthew wrote that the city was "stirred," and that people were asking, "Who is this." This is when the authorities really became aware that Jesus, the worker of miracles was going to be in town. He had been an increasing threat to the authority of the Pharisees and Sadducees and John informs us in John 11:45-57, that the Chief Priests and Pharisees had already issued an arrest warrant. They just didn't know where he was or where he would be, and for the time being Jesus wanted to keep it that way.

We are told by Mark that Jesus entered Jerusalem, went to the temple, looked around and returned to Bethany because it was already getting late. So, Jesus probably left the temple area around 5:00 PM, and started back to Bethany. That night he prepared for his final confrontations with the beast.
