THE 7 LAST DAYS OF JESUS' LIFE

Day 3 in the series

Monday

Jesus rolled out of bed on Monday focused on one target. The temple. Herod started renovating Zerubbabel's temple around 20 BC. The renovations were not completed until 63 AD, 67 years after Herod's death. So, when Jesus was in Jerusalem for the last time the temple was under construction. Herod's temple was mammoth. It was larger than Solomon's, but not as opulent. In Solomon's temple everything was overlaid with gold, even the floor. But Herod's emphasis was on size. We are told that Herod expanded the size of the temple grounds. Though the size of both court yards is conjecture, the point is they were really big. Herod's temple took 76 years longer to complete than Solomon's temple, so it's easy to visualize that it became larger. It was the main symbol of Judaism and Jesus was going to attack its religious significance.

We find in Mark 11:12-14 an unusual event. Jesus apparently got up early and set out for Jerusalem before eating. On the way he tried to get some figs from a fig tree. The tree was a disappointment. It had leaves but no figs. The reason that there was no fruit was that it was too early in the season. When Jesus didn't find any fruit, he cursed the tree. Jesus didn't give a reason for the curse. However, some scholars believe it showed God's disappointment with the Jewish nation, which should have been more evangelistic toward the gentiles. If one thinks Jesus was a tad angry, you could be right. Though Jesus' actions and words were divinely calculated that does not negate the possibility that Jesus was upset. (See Numbers 11:10). From the fig tree Jesus goes directly to the temple, but this visit is NOT peaceful.

Mark records that Jesus entered the temple area where the moneychangers and the sellers of sacrificial animals had their shops. He turned their tables and drove them out. He said, "My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations'? But you have made it a den of robbers." Verse 18 tells us that the that the chief priests and

teachers of the law wanted to kill Jesus because they were afraid of him.

Why would they fear Jesus? Because he was threatening their chief source of income. The high priest's office had been bought and sold for over 100 years, and the house of Annas was in control of the temple from 7 AD to 68 AD. They charged Jews bringing tithes and offerings exorbitant prices to exchange foreign money into Jewish sheckles, cheated those wanting to purchase animals for sacrifice.

When you threaten the mob's source of income your days are numbered. Jesus was challenging their long-held concept of what it meant to be Jewish, and the importance of the temple. Without the temple there would be no worshipers, no control over the people, and the wealth it generated would wither and die. Think about it. If you want to be noticed by our government go to the headquarters of the IRS in Washington DC, enter the building, chase the workers out, overturn their desks, overturn their files, and delete all their tax records. If you survive the visit, you will definitely be on their radar. They will want you BAD. The chief priests wanted Jesus BAD.

We don't know how long this encounter lasted. Probably not long. Maybe 5 to 15 minutes. But as soon as it was over Jesus left. He had poked the beast hard, and they would want their pound of flesh. As Jesus and the apostles walked back to Bethany can you imagine what the apostles thought and/or said. Growing up there were times when I wanted to get as far away from my brother as I could because he was in serious trouble. No matter how much I loved him it was time to stay out of the line of fire. Though at this time the apostles showed no signs of abandoning Jesus you wonder if they were starting to feel the need to distance themselves from him and the high priests retribution.

In 3 days, they would bolt.
