THE 7 LAST DAYS OF JESUS' LIFE

Day 5 in the series

Wednesday

In 1983, a Wellington, Texas deacon convinced me that I should run in a 10 K race with him. The race was in three weeks. I was thirty -three and had in the past done some long distance running so I figured why not. After all, how hard could it be? It would only be a little over six and a half miles. I went out to a little used country road. measured off the one-mile mark, the two-mile mark, and finally the three-mile mark. My goal was to eventually be able to run to the three mile marker then return. The next day I only ran one mile because I was no fool. I realized you didn't just go out and run six miles. Well, one mile was easy, cheesy. On day two I ran two miles. I wisely decided to work up to the distance slowly. I didn't want to stress myself so I ran two miles again on day three. But things interrupted my schedule as they always did and I found that I wouldn't be ready in three weeks unless I increased the schedule. So, on the first day of week number two I decided to go for it. Yep, six and a half miles. I won't mention my time, but I made it back to the car alive. I drove home and went to bed. Hettie brought me dinner which I refused. It hurt to get up. It hurt to lay down. It hurt to breath.

Yep, I thought I was going to die. I had run on Monday and it was Wednesday before I could get out of bed. My muscles ached for two weeks. I missed the 10 K race.

I don't know if Jesus was tired on Wednesday after Tuesday's confrontations with the religious leaders in Jerusalem, but he had every right to feel that way. He had bested the foremost religious thinkers of his day and certainly deserved a day of rest.

The scripture doesn't give a clue about his activities on Wednesday, but I believe he was busy. I am sure that his disciples sought clarification on his comments about the tribulation and the second coming. But the issue that really needed clarification was his statement that in two days he would be crucified. His disciples believed he was the Messiah. He was greeted as the Messiah by the crowds on Sunday. The disciples had learned as children that the Messiah would be king. They were taught that the Messiah would establish

an eternal kingdom. Therefore, the Messiah couldn't die. Yet, Jesus said he would be crucified. This was a contradiction. The disciples needed time to digest this.

The other high priority for Jesus was meditation. In thirty-six hours Jesus would institute the Lord's Supper during the Passover Feast and in about forty-eight hours he would be on the cross. He needed some alone time with his Father.

While there seemed to be little physical exertion on Wednesday, there were monumental spiritual forces on the move. On the one hand, Jesus was communing with his Father to strengthen his spiritual and physical fortitude for the coming trial and crucifixion. On the other, Judas was meeting with chief priests to discuss the arrest of Jesus.

Did you ever wonder why Judas would betray Jesus? This question has perplexed me for most of my life. Was it greed? Why would Judas turn in the most wanted man in Palestine for 30 pieces of silver, the price the owner of a bull was required to pay the owner of a slave, if his bull killed the slave (Exodus 21:32). It doesn't make sense. He could have asked for much more. I like what one commentator wrote, "Judas could have been moved by any one of a number of motives or a combination of several." So, let's examine some other possibilities.

It has been noted that Judas was the only apostle who was not from Galilee. He was from Kerioth, a town about thirty-five miles south of Jerusalem. But coming from a different region shouldn't create enough animosity to succumb to betrayal.

Perhaps it was disappointment and anger because Jesus was not the Messiah Judas expected or wanted. When Jesus entered Jerusalem on Sunday the crowds shouted, "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." Mark's account tells us the crowds rejoiced at "the coming kingdom of our father David," and Luke records that they referred to Jesus as the "King". So, if Judas was looking towards the prospect of being the treasurer of an earthly kingdom without boundaries, he was greatly disappointed when Jesus didn't even attempt to claim the title "King." And, on Tuesday when Jesus predicted his crucifixion on Friday all of Judas' hopes and dreams died. How utterly crushed he must have been.

If you are a driven individual, what do you do when your plans to be

successful and influential fail? You find another way. Perhaps, in Judas' mind he was simply abandoning a failing cause. If Jesus was not the path to success and influence for Judas then maybe he would find success and influence in the Sanhedrin by betraying Jesus.

Some have suggested that Judas' betrayal was his attempt to force Jesus to miraculously call down God's angels to destroy Rome and assume the throne of an earthly kingdom. If so, it didn't work.

When you sift all the possible reasons for the betrayal through the sieve of logic and truth you are faced with the basest reason of all. The same one that exiled Adam and Eve from the garden. It is the same one that builds barricades between God and us. Selfishness.

Tomorrow, Thursday, the world would begin to change. Thursday evening would be Friday in Palestine, and the Jewish people would celebrate the Passover.
