### My Apologies

Most of you know that I'm a teacher. I teach Science (yay!) - 8th grade. (I'm used to the collective groan/sympathetic nod at this point, Iol). I sometimes even get a 'Bless your heart'. It's okay, I get it. They are a tough lot to deal with most days. Not little kids anymore, but not quite adults either...With a whole MESS of hormones to knock them off balance. They remind me of the response Eema (voiced by Della Reese) gave in the animated movie "Dinosaur" when asked what a Carnotaur was "...A mouth full of teeth with a bad attitude!" But, I digress.

Recently, during my conference period, I heard a teacher in the hallway speaking a little loudly and I assumed she was having a *Come-to-Jesus* moment with a student. Turns out, she was actually on the phone with her son, who had gotten into a bit of trouble at his school. Let me tell you, she was taking no prisoners! D (her first initial) was sorely irritated to find out that her son had disrespected his teacher - somewhat loudly - in class. D has high expectations and standards for her children, much as our God does for us, and she let him know in no uncertain terms what she thought about the entire incident. One phrase she directed at him seemed to jump out at me. When she listed out to him what he needed to do to make amends, D told him an apology to his teacher was needed, as well as his classmates. She then told him, "And it better not be some mealy-mouth, mumbly 'sorry' or 'my bad', while staring at the floor. Especially when his disrespect had been plenty loud for all to hear. D told him: "Let your apology be as loud as your disrespect!" \*\*\*Mic drop\*\*\*

I'll say it again – Let Your Apology Be As *Loud* As Your *Disrespect*. Can I get an 'Amen'?! Yaaasssss!!!

Now at first, I just took this in the context it was given. Then, it began to dawn on me - how many times have I disrespected God and then wanted to mumble a hasty apology and 'forgive me'? We (and by that, I mean ME) often take it for granted that God will forgive anything we ask. He is the Master of extending grace and mercy. But doesn't He deserve an apology (repentance) that matches our disrespect (disobedience)? In Malachi, the Lord accuses Israel of bringing Him blemished offerings: "'When you bring blind animals for sacrifice, is that not wrong? When you sacrifice crippled or diseased animals, is that not wrong? Try offering them to your governor! Would he be pleased with you? Would he accept you?' says the Lord Almighty." In effect, their apology was nowhere near as loud as their disrespect.

We may not be required to present sacrifices in the same manner anymore, but we do need to present ourselves to God when we sin; and doesn't He deserve to hear it "Loud and Proud" when we 'apologize' for messing up (again) and ask for His forgiveness? Any time we find ourselves needing to apologize and ask for forgiveness – from God, our family, our friends, our coworkers - it needs to be presented honestly, with humbleness; but directly, and with accountability. A true and sincere apology or repentance means we will do our utmost NOT to repeat the offense. But aren't we lucky that if, no make that **when**, we do sin, we have a loving God that will listen and then forgive. Again and again and again. So when that happens, I'm going to do my utmost to recall my new self-directive:

Let My Apology Be As Loud As My Disrespect


