Please forgive the mass nature of this letter. My name is Bryan Barrett. I am the Life Recovery minister for the Southside church of Christ here in Fort Worth. I am attempting to contact each congregation in our heritage, in our area, regarding partnership in our Food Pantry. We are an inner-city church; a mission church to our neighbors. Each Tuesday morning, we give out groceries to around 200 of our impoverished neighbors. Our food supply is beginning to run low to the point that we almost run out each week.

We are asking your church to partner with us in this food mission. You can help support us with a regular financial gift, regularly contribute canned and packaged foods, and/or work side by side with us on Tuesdays as we give out the food. It is a wonderful ministry and one that several of our congregations, large and small can partner in. We really want this to be a kingdom building thing. We want the encouragement of working alongside you. The old devil seems to be having his way in the world, but we all know that good deeds are unassailable and by doing them together they will know we are Christians by our love for each other.

Memorials

God set several memorials for His people, the Israelites, to observe. Passover, Pentecost, Feast of Tabernacles, Feast of first-fruits and the Day of Atonement. The times and way of observing them was written in the Scriptures. God had Joshua set up stones at the crossing of the Jordan when the nation entered into the promised land after the forty-years of wandering in the wilderness. These stones would be a memorial of God's powerful hand in leading Israel and was to remind the following generations of God's provisions and deliverance.

Jehovah instructed Moses to set up the regulations of Passover. This would be a yearly observance for the nation. They would observe it, being reminded of God's deliverance of the people from slavery. That began immediately upon the exodus from Egypt. 1500 years later the Jewish nation still observed it when Jesus came to earth. This feast was truly a memorial. God's plan included having the Messiah become the Passover Lamb that would be sacrificed at Passover.

Israel would remember that the night God sent death into the homes throughout Egypt, the blood of the lamb over the doors saved the first-born from certain death. "The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you." (Ex. 11:13)

As a nation, we have memorials as well. Places and monuments are set to serve us as a reminder of what, who, how and why something is important. Our Memorial Day is celebrated annually to honor all those who have dies while serving in the United States military. So, we pause, we pray, we give thanks, we shed tears over the loss of lives that protect us from harm. When observed well, people will cherish the freedom and peace found in our land.

When the body of Christ faithfully observes the death, burial and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God who takes away our sines; the church will cherish the salvation found only in the Gospel of Jesus. Spiritual salvation will be held high above all else. So, we assemble as God has ordained to observe the memorial feast by breaking the bread and drinking the cup at the Lord's Table. We remember the cost of our salvation. We pause, we pray, we give thanks, we may shed tears over the suffering of our Lord.
