RETRO INSPIRATION

Prayer Life

I'm going to be brutally honest here. I don't feel like I have the intimate prayer life I should. I fully believe in the power of prayer. I've seen miracles and answered prayers. So don't get me wrong I pray. I talk to God. I thank Him for blessings, I ask Him for healing-physical and spiritualboth for myself and others. I ask for forgiveness of my sins, I ask Him to guide our leaders and protect our military. I pray when friends ask. But it's usually in my head, not out loud. I'm so self-conscious when I try to pray out loud. I makes me think of the passage in Matthew 6 that instructs us to "not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others." Or the next verse that says "do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, they think they will be heard for their many words." I almost feel like I'm talking to an empty room, trying to put on a show when I pray out loud. I feel hypocritical because He seems so far away and unreachable to me. I hear others pray and I'm almost jealous. They seem to have a real relationship with God. I know I should feel close to Him. I know He's right there whenever I need Him. Then I sometimes think "Why would He even listen to me? I'm nobody important. I shouldn't bother Him." I mean He's GOD! All knowing, all powerful. What difference could my silly words make anyway?

So, I wondered how do I build a relationship with God? How do I move past this, how do I grow closer to Him? Ironically, the answer came to me while trying to teach someone else how to pray. My child. I want her to have the closeness I crave. I don't want her to miss out on that. I heard myself telling her the other day to just talk to God. Just talk to Him like He's sitting right there next to her. I told her she doesn't have to recite a practiced rhyme, but to simply have a conversation like it was with me or her daddy. Because after all, God made all of us and He's our Father. He wants us to confide in Him so He can take care of us. She seemed to like that. And then it struck me—well hadn't I better take the log out of my own eye before trying to remove the splinter from hers? Physician Heal thyself!

So, I'm working on it. I'm praying—out loud with my child. We talk to God and I know He's listening. After all, He's my Father.

Pray for my journey please. And if you need me to pray for you, just ask. I'll be talking to Him.

Fruit of the Spirit-Goodness

Goodness, defined as "the quality of being morally good or virtuous," manifests itself externally in the behavior of an individual. Goodness reflects the commitment to God and to sharing His love with others. Often we hear someone say, "God is good," and the response of those around is "All the time." This is a true statement. God is indeed good all the time. Unless your life reflects that goodness of God, you may be seen as unkind, bad, unloving, or other negative behaviors, even selfishness. Fill your life with God's Word and let His goodness flow from your heart.

Generosity is one major part of goodness. It is unselfish and expresses itself through sharing. It extends to family and friends, strangers, and particularly those in need, and is offered not only as money, food and clothing, but also as time shared and assistance provided. In one's life; this is often described as sharing your time, talent and treasure.

Jesus is our best example of what generosity looks like. While Jesus didn't have much money, He was the most generous person who ever lived. Jesus listened, He healed, He taught, He led others and then He gave His life for all mankind.

So how can we show the kind of generosity that Jesus did? When we live by the Fruit of the Spirit everything we do is because we have the love of Jesus in us. Remember that everything that we own is first owned by God. So sure, give generously financially. But give your time to those who need someone to talk to. Make meals for those who are sick. Where you see a need, fill it. Most of all, be generous in sharing the Gospel, because that is the greatest need of all.
