REFLECTIONS ON A RECOMMENDED READING

The Abolition of Man is a book written by C.S. Lewis, and has been one of my favorites. It has been one of the few books I've picked up multiple times a year and reread sections, if not the whole thing. Living in a time governed not by the Fed nor by the state, but by the direction of the media, we need C.S. Lewis' wisdom more than ever.

The great thing about his wisdom is that it didn't originate with him. The concepts that he speaks about in the 3-part lecture series are biblical concepts applied to an ever-evolving society. In short, Lewis' thoughts are timeless because they find their anchor in the TRUTH; not everything is subjective.

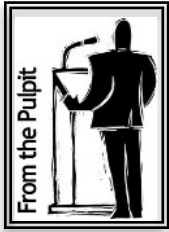
Would anyone ever want to be guided by falsehood? Christians ought not be driven by the media, a group dependent on the 'almighty dollar', but by the cross, a symbol of God's Love. Our daily thoughts and philosophies should not be seeded or changed by the media, but by the carpenter who began shaping us 2000 years ago. Our passions and fervency should not be motivated by cinematography, music, or even a good, well-timed photo which accompanies a seemingly sad story, but by the urgency of eternity.

If we're not careful, our diet, which Hebrews tells us should shift from milk to solid food, will quickly be replaced by political rhetoric, identity pandering, and even pointless grief. If, however, we maintain the course that the gospel sets us on, we will have nothing to be ashamed of and no reason for apology. We will continue to be a people whose discernment is rightly guided by our new compassionate heart, and not the ever changing, ever dividing, politically enslaving narratives of the media.

In any sports a lack of focus makes you lose the game. The same is true with our faith. Don't lose sight of what is important.

You are an ambassador of Jesus Christ and called to share his TRUTH; the Gospel.
