What We Should Pray About

Quite often I struggle to come up with things to pray about without saying the same things over and over. When I say the same things a lot, it becomes "routine," and I begin to lose focus. Fortunately, the Bible is full of ideas for improving our prayer lives. With that in mind, what SHOULD we be praying for?

First and foremost, we should be praising and thanking God! Next, we should confess our sins and our anxieties. Lay them all out for God, asking for forgiveness or help as appropriate. This humbles us and causes us to rely on God's mercy and grace. (1 John 1:9, Proverbs 28:13, 1 Peter 5:6-7, Mark 9:24) There are many situations and people we should be praying for. Some are specific to our lives today (like a family member with a medical need), and some are generic to everyone (like government). 1 Timothy 2:1-2 says, "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way." It doesn't matter who is in charge and whether or not we agree with their decisions. We still must pray that God's will be done through the actions of our government so that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life.

We should pray about other churches. A perfect example of this is in 1 Thess. 1:2, where Paul states: "We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers," In fact, each time Paul writes a letter to a church, he mentions that he has been praying for them! Not only should we pray for other congregations, but we should pray for those who are teaching and leading them so that they will be brought to a better understanding of God's word and be able to spread the Gospel to more people. This is especially true for congregations like those brothers and sisters in Christ in Malawi. Specifically, Snowden and Susan.

Ultimately, there are many, many people and things that someone can pray about. In fact, more ideas can come from reading through prayer hymns in our songbook. All you must do is start praying and keep it up. Form habits and routines, and perhaps even keep a prayer journal, as you consider one last scripture, 1 Thess. 5:16-18: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Because there is always something more to pray about.
