Paul writes in Philippians 4: 4

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!"

They were the one group that was watching out for Paul by sending him money and people to be with him and care for him while he was in prison. What if Paul was writing his letter to me (Dean) today? Considering everything that has gone on in the last six months and even the last few weeks, Paul would need to tell me to "Rejoice." So, the question is, "Why did Paul need to tell the Philippians to "Rejoice?" I do not know this answer, but I do have a few thoughts about this.

There are a few people we know that no matter how bad things are and no matter what happens to them, they have "Joy" in their heart.

There are also some people that when things are good then there is much joy and happiness. But when things are bad, then things are bad and there is "no joy in Mudville," if you know what I mean.

Then we have those people that it does not matter if things are going well or not so well, it is always doom and gloom. Even after we receive from God blessing after blessing, we complain and moan. We seem to not to be able to find any reason to have Joy.

Brothers and sisters, I confess to you that I am afraid I belong in this last group. I have seen God's miracles in my life over and over again and yet I need Paul to tell me to Rejoice. I urge each of you to pray with me that no matter what happens to us, good or bad, that we will have joy in our heart because we have the greatest gift there is. Salvation. No matter what.
