#### Family

Many years ago when my father was dying my sisters and I purchased a book for my dad titled, "Grandfather Remembers". It is a book of questions and open-ended statements to be filled in describing your life's journey. We used the book as a tool to document facts about his life as well as to elicit stories from his childhood he had never really shared with us prior to this time. In 1934 when my father was 5 years old his mother died from complications of pregnancy. He had four sisters ranging in age from 3 years old to 12. The book helped us to draw out stories of what life was like living on a farm with 5 young children learning to cook, sew and care for themselves while their father worked long hours in the fields.

My strongest memory of the book was a prompt that simply said "What I loved about my father was \_\_\_\_\_." My dad completed that sentence by saying "that he loved me and my sisters so much and he kept us together after our mother died". What we learned was that when their mother had died, different relatives offered to take this child or that child. But my dad's father refused, choosing to keep their family intact. The experiences they shared and their dependence on each other forged very strong feelings about family.

Our families today are under attack. I'm sure that we all know families who have been torn apart. We need to remain committed to keeping our families strong and together. We may not have to live through some of the extreme circumstances that my father did. But we all have our stories, our difficult times as well as our times of happiness. We can use these shared experiences to strengthen our family bonds. We can pray for God's help and guidance that we glorify Him with our families. - Andrea Corder
