One of my favorite stories that Jesus gave us was the parable of the lost sheep. You remember that one don't you? There were one hundred sheep that were being watched and cared for. Ninety-nine of the sheep were safe or saved. They were ok. They were headed in the right direction. However one sheep was not ok. That little sheep had strayed off. It was on its own in the big world and things weren't going well. It needed help. It needed to be found. So what does the Shepherd do? He leaves the ninety-nine and goes and looks for that one lost sheep until he finds it. When he does eventually find that lost sheep, he is so overjoyed that he can hardly contain it. He is euphoric. The lost sheep is found, all is right in the world.

I'm afraid that there are some folks who are reading this who believe that their sins are so great that God could never forgive them. They are weighted down by memories of what they were, not who they are now. My wonderful brothers and sisters this little parable proclaims that even if you were a lost sheep, you don't have to worry anymore. Jesus cares especially for those who have deep, sinful scars. In fact, he honors anyone who has the courage to change and allow him into their lives. He is overjoyed with your change and welcomes you with wide, open arms like a Shepherd carrying that one sheep back to the ninety-nine.

Never, ever, let your past keep you from allowing Jesus into your life now. You are loved and the good news is that he allows you to change and be found again. Being a lost sheep is not the end for you, it's just the start of being found again by your Shepherd.
