

More Good News - Malawi Update

Snoden has reported that fifteen of the children in the preschool program are seven years old and truly need to be in Kindergarten. In his discussions with government officials, it appears the Malawian government is favorable to allowing Snoden to add a Kindergarten program to the existing school. This addition would allow those older children to move up, subsequently opening fifteen spots for new children. Adding another grade level will require more teachers. Currently, the only permanent teachers they have are Snoden's wife Susan and her assistant Madalo.

God has greatly blessed the program, allowing for the purchase of uniforms and even shoes for each student. Also, the program feeds not only students at the school, but also a large number of children that come just to be fed.

The maize crop is healthy and producing an abundance. So much so, in fact, that Snoden feels a storage building is needed to contain the harvest. This is another immediate need that should be covered in prayer. There is still the hope and early plans to be able to feed the children a more varied diet and to feed them twice each day, rather than only once each day which is currently all they are able to do.

The wall around the property remains high on the priority list as well. John has asked Snoden to create an estimate of costs for the completion of the wall and for construction of the storage building, as well as the cost of hiring another teacher.

Snoden and Susan's love for all the children in the program is incredibly obvious. They're filled with joy at the prospect of being able to help more of the village children.
