Christian Education

Part Two in a series

One of the earliest methods of teaching in schools was the catechetical method. It emphasized questioning and answering. The goal was not to get memorized answers to the questions, but for the student to show an understanding of both question and answer. In this type of instruction both student and teacher asked and answered questions. Each student was orally tested at the beginning of his education by the teacher to determine the student's lack of knowledge and understanding. This way a teacher could establish a starting point for the student's instruction. The best way to understand this teaching method is to equate it with modern day tutors. The student was alone with the instructor. Using this approach, the teacher was assured that the student understood the lesson's content.

The church started this method of instruction in the first and second centuries. It was practiced in the perfected form between 325 to 450 A.D. After 450 A.D. this type of instruction deteriorated. The growth of the practice of infant baptism accounted in a large part for this deterioration. Infant baptism changed the time of systematic instruction from before baptism to after baptism. The church failed to establish a way to teach those who were baptized in infancy, and relegated Christian Education to the home. Thus, education became devalued and neglected because parents worked and had other responsibilities. During this time many sermons were given, and tracts written admonishing parents to educate their children. Finally, when the church and state formed an alliance during the reign of Constantine there was no system to instruct adults and children who joined the church.
