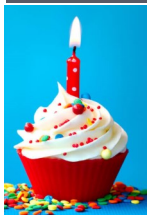

Christian Education

Part Three in a series

Hellenism and Christianity shared the Roman Empire, but there was a vast difference. The Greeks sought to find truth through reason while Christians believed that truth had been revealed in Christ. Greek culture emphasized reason and cultivated the intellect, and Christians emphasized faith and cultivated the soul. Pantaenus and others who first combined the Greek culture and Christianity had a good motive for trying to use reason and intellect to explain and reinforce the tenets of Christianity, but it opened the gates to the subtle influence of humanistic thought which undermined all of Christianity.

By the time the Council of Nicaea met in 325 A.D. the church was departing from Christian principals and truth. The council might have reversed the trend or at least slowed it down, but philosophical and pagan teachings had become so entangled with Christian doctrine as to confuse even the church leaders in their thinking. If the council had taken a stand for the Bible and the simple teachings of the apostles unspoiled by Greek pagan thought, the medieval church might have been able to fill the place God intended it to fill and the course of history would have been different. Instead, the council yielded to the influence of Greek philosophy and strengthened the tendency toward its progress. From this union of philosophy and Christianity developed a worldly minded and apostate church. The church had become an organization which offered an educational program that emphasized religion and church, to the destruction of Christian principles and doctrine.
