Christian Education

Part six in a series

The reformation started before Henry VIII of England broke away from the Catholic Church and founded the Anglican Church in 1534. John Wycliffe's translation of the Bible came out in 1384, the same year that Wycliffe died. England then became a doctrinal battle ground. Wycliffe, who has been called the "morning star of the English Reformation, was declared a heretic in 1415. Then in 1428 his bones were dug up and burned. When Henry VIII entered the fray in 1509 the apple cart was not only upset, but it was also thrown out the window. He executed Thomas Wolsey and Thomas More both highly respected Catholics, and then sentenced the Reformers Thomas Cromwell and John Firth to death. In 1525 William Tyndale's English translation of the Bible was published. For this heresy Tyndale was tracked down and strangled in 1536. When Queen Mary succeeded Henry in 1547, she continued the assault on the Reformation by executing Thomas Cranmer. But God's Word CANNOT be silenced. The King James Version was authorized by King James in 1611. Its translators relied heavily on Tyndale's translation.

By the 1700s England was ready to deal with other national issues. During this time children were working 12 hours a day, 6 days a week alongside their parents, and still the families were drowning in poverty. Illiteracy was rampant because there was no public education. Education was once again the privilege of the rich and powerful. But in 1751 a movement began at St. Mary's Church in Nottingham. It was school, and it was on the only day of the week that people did not work. It became known as Sunday School. In 1781 Robert Raikes, a newspaper editor, opened the flood gates by starting a Sunday School in several places. It was mainly for children and teens, but eventually adults could attend. Their textbook was the only widely published book in England. The Bible. Teachers taught reading and writing. By 1785 Sunday School attendance exploded to 250,000 every Sunday. As attendance soared churches started providing a small meal to attendees and added arithmetic to the curriculum. Sunday School attendance reached 1,200,000 in 1831. The influence that Sunday School and the Scripture had on the nation Is interesting. In 1833 Parliament passed the Factory Act which prevented child labor, and the Slavery Abolition Act that effectively ended slavery in England. The Poor Law Amendment Act which standardized the provision for the poor was passed the following year in 1834.

But with the rising attendance came the formation of Sunday School Societies, Unions, and government involvement. Because of this there was less emphasis on the Bible and more emphasis on Spelling, Reading, Writing, and Math books. Sunday School was still the heart of English Education, but ever so slowly Christian doctrine was uninvited. Finally in 1870 Parliament passed the Elementary Education Act which mandated and funded a national system of schools. Though Sunday School in churches continued its influence was greatly diminished.
