Christian Education

Part Ten - Lessons Learned

One of the first comments about Christian Education is found in Matthew 28:19-20. There Jesus says, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, **TEACHING** them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you even to the end of the age." I added the bold letters and the underline. That Jesus mentions it, however, indicates its importance.

We have a dilemma concerning "teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you....." The priority of teaching is not only reflected in Matthew 28, but it is mentioned 22 times between Romans and III John. So, how do we ensure that Christ's message is not lost by this generation. For us to be successful we must learn from the past. That saying is true, "If you don't learn from the past you are doomed to repeat it."

Lesson One

Jesus believed in education. He also believed that religious hierarchies, institutions, traditions, and reverence for places were detrimental and dangerous to salvation. Jesus's beliefs about these things have been verified by history. It was the Council of Nicaea that validated pagan influence in the early church. During the Medieval Era, the church had a stranglehold on the scriptures. Then, in England the Anglican Church and Puritans became embroiled in a bloody civil war. Finally, when Sunday School came along in the latter 1700s its effectiveness in disseminating the gospel and changing society was curtailed by all the societies, unions, and boards that replaced local control with denominational hierarchies. So, the first lesson is to beware of outside organizations who want to exert control over the local church. History shows that at best loss of local control improves things for a short time, and at worst leads to replacing Jesus's command to "make disciples," with social reforms.

Lesson Two

Christian Education works. The local churches conducted organized classes for all ages interested in converting to Christianity as far back as the 2^{nd} century. Christian Education was the cornerstone of the Reformation and Tyndale translations of the Bible. Finally, one cannot deny the influence of early

Sunday School contributions to Society in both England and America. In both countries Christian Education through Sunday School had a positive effect on the crime rate. In England child labor laws were enacted and slavery ended during this time. While in America the church and Cherokee Tribe won Worcster vs. Georgia in the United States Supreme Court in an attempt to help the Cherokee Tribe keep its ancestral homelands. Christian Education advocates high moral values, and ethical behavior, much in need during our times. Studying God's Word is valuable for our spirit, mind, and soul, no matter if it is in the morning, noon, or night.

So how do we carry out the Great Commission? What is the best way to bring others to Christ? The best way is not a sermon on Sunday morning. A sermon should probably be aimed at believers, to help them in their walk with Christ. The best way to bring others to Christ is in a classroom or home, where there can be a free exchange of thoughts and feelings about Christ. Deciding to follow Christ is a deeply personal issue and though we celebrate those decisions in public, it is a decision reached through a struggle in the soul. It is in the home or classroom where those decisions are made, and those studies are called Christian Education.
