Women of the Bible by the women of Westworth-Issue

REBEKAH

Tracy Robertson

Daughter, wife, mother, schemer.....Servant. Her story takes you on a roller coaster of emotions, doesn't it? When she is first introduced, it's easy to admire her. She is kind, thoughtful, pure. Rebekah not only gives a stranger a drink, she tends to all of his livestock. *Prayer answered.*

She is willing to leave her home and family to go marry a stranger - all in obedience to God. *Prayer answered.* Then, we learn she was barren for 20 years after marrying Isaac, and we're moved to feel sympathy for her. When Isaac prays to God on her behalf and He blesses her with a pregnancy - with twins, no less - oh happy day! *Prayer answered.* We rejoice with her. But when her pregnancy becomes tiresome and difficult, and she whines to God "why is this happening to me", it's easy to become disappointed in her and even judge her for not continuing to be grateful that she's going to be a mother. In Genesis 25:28 I even feel irritated and a little angry with her, and Isaac too. They have each come to love their 'favorite' son. Hmph!

Growing up, I heard the story of Jacob and Esau many times. One of my first thoughts was how ridiculous it was for Esau to trade his birthright for a mere meal. Pretty expensive bowl of stew! Then, when Rebekah devises a plan to fool Isaac, so that her favorite, the one she *loves* receives the blessing...it rivals the best (or worst) soap opera storyline. The idea of stealing from one child to give to the other was so foreign to me. I mean, who does that? Aren't mothers supposed to love their children equally? I was certain she was a bad mother, her love was warped. And I remember thinking too, how both Isaac and Esau must have felt so betrayed by the two of them.

But in my haste to condemn Rebekah, and Jacob as well, for their deceit, I overlooked a very important detail - God had already prophesied to Rebekah while she was still pregnant, that "Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples from within you will be separated; one people will be stronger than the other, and *the older will serve the younger.*" Wait, hold up now. God told her before her sons were even born what needed to happen - what *would* happen. Thus, by her suggesting the ruse that achieves it, Rebekah is carrying out God's will. Rebekah serves God and preserves the ancestral lineage. Mic drop.

How many times have we (and by that I mean me), questioned negative events or circumstances and why they were allowed to happen? Terrorist attacks, disasters, our COVID lockdown, lost jobs, children suffering or dying, betrayals. Where is our trust in God and His will, His perfect timing? It gets pushed aside by our lack of faith, our impatience, our confusion and even indignance and anger. Oh, how lucky we are that God has infinite patience! I know I test Him every day, and He never fails me. You can't outgive God!

Rebekah's story reminds me that even though all throughout the Bible it reflects a concern with patrilineage—tracing families through the male line, it sometimes obscures the fact that those family stories include strong female characters, the matriarchs. These dynamic women serve a purpose, fulfil prophecies, honor God. Rebekah is a strong reminder to me that my role is valuable and to never doubt how God might need to use me to work His plan to perfection.
