WOMEN OF THE BIBLE BY THE WOMEN OF WESTWORTH-NO. 3

Jochebed

Jochebed, whose name translates to "Jehovah glorified" in the Hebrew language, was the mother of Moses. She became pregnant at a perilous time for Jewish male infants in Egypt. The Pharoah had decreed that all male babies born were to be put to death by the midwives when they were delivered. When Moses was born the brave midwives and Moses' family defied the order and hid him for three months. Can you imagine the fear of being found out, which would probably lead to death not only for Moses but also his parents, leaving the other children as orphans? I believe there must have been fervent prayer on the part of Jochebed for a way to save her son's life

Trusting in God's providence, she devised a plan using the skills she possessed. She weaved a basket from reeds and coated it with tar so that it would float on the Nile River. Perhaps she was a slave at the palace, because she new the exact spot where the Pharoah's daughter bathed each day. Jochebed placed Moses in the basked in the river towards the spot where the princess would be bathing and sent her daughter to the other side to observe what would happen when the basket reached its destination. What trust and courage she displayed as she trusted her son Moses to God's safekeeping.

When the princess saw the little floating arc, she sent her maid to retrieve it, and when the baby cried, she desired to keep the baby for herself as her maternal instincts were stirred. Jochebed's daughter, as instructed by her mother, ran to the princess, and offered to find a Hebrew mother to nurse the baby for the princess. Of course, that was Jochebed, ensuring that she could continue to bond and have a strong influence on baby Moses. At that time, babies were nursed for at least four years, so she was able to instill a love and commitment to God in her son. Her courage and trust led to Moses' safely leading the Israelites out of Egypt into the promised land. We don't know if Jochebed was alive to see the results of her trust, but we do know that she followed God's leading in saving her son. Her story shows us that God can use ordinary people to help accomplish great things. While God did not speak audibly to Jochebed, she was guided and inspired to save her son. We too, can hear God's voice by being in the WORD consistently, listening for God's spirit to guide us, and living by the principles shown to us in the Bible. This will help us to have the courage and wisdom to be able to trust and follow God's leading in our lives, so that we can help accomplish great things for our Father.
