CRF Newsletter- Christian Relief Fund, Amarillo Texas.

- Sept 2021 This edition includes information about the crisis in Haiti and how they are trying to help. It also includes information on how (and why) you can "Give a Goat". (that does <u>not</u> mean 'greatest of all time').
- Oct 2021 This issue focuses on the needs in Kenya. Villages with no food or water for the children. According to this newsletter, approximately 3 million people in northern Kenya are at risk of starvation as a result of droughts, ethnic clashes and locust invasions. Reading these stories certainly brings to our attention the abundance we enjoy and pricks our conscience to share.
- **Namikango Mission news**, Sep-Oct 2021 information regarding celebration of 60 years for this mission work. Headquarters for this work is in Lubbock.
- India Missions report for September and August 2021 Church of Christ India Missions overseen by the Shiloh Church of Christ in Hazel Green, Alabama. These 2 additions include information about hard decisions regarding how to use the funds available to them, and words about the "real" work of their ministry. Additionally, many short stories of interest about the people involved in this work and those they encounter while doing that work.
- Healing Hands International News, Fall 2021 issue. (HHI is headquartered in Nashville, TN.) This issue includes stories about many African mission efforts including water wells, teaching local people to raise food crops, MA-GI boxes, training women with life sustaining skills, and Haiti earthquake aid.
- <u>The Spiritual Sword</u>, Vol. 53, October 2021 Sponsored by Getwell Church of Christ, Memphis, TN. Theme of this issue: "The Church Everywhere Spoken Against". Several writers share their insight regarding criticisms of the Church of Christ and provide reason for some of the differences in our practices.

- The **Messenger** a newsletter from Tipton's Children's home in Tipton, Oklahoma. This issue shares information about baptisms for some of the young people they house and care for, along with pictures of summer events provided for the residents of the home.
- The Search Light October 2021 Reports news of 'In Search of the Lords Way', the Television Ministry of the Edmond Church of Christ, Edmond, OK. This edition includes a list of programs scheduled for November 2021, information on music available for download and a complete listing of TV, radio and cable networks that carry the program.
- House to House Heart to Heart volume 26, number 10. Published monthly by the East Ridge Church of Christ in East Ridge, TN. Worry Much? This issue includes an article explaining why Christians should not worry and scripture to back it up. It also offers some thoughts on "Will We Know Each Other in Heaven?" The Philemon Pickle

During high school I made several discoveries that would have a lasting impact on my life. The most important was the Bible. It has and continues to alter my life. The second was a little known biography written in 1906. The title of the book was "The Story of a White Slave." It was the story of my great great grandfather, John Fowler. This was to say the least confusing because I had studied world history and United States history, and no text or teacher mentioned White Slaves. I was sure slavery was a malicious evil perpetrated on the Africans by white Colonists. Yet, my great great grandfather was a slave. This did not make sense; something or someone was wrong. At the least there was missing information about slaves and slavery.

I decided to look in the scripture and was absolutely appalled that God did not ban slavery in the Old Testament, nor did Jesus or Paul in the New Testament. In fact, when Paul had the chance to help a run-a-way slave escape his master Paul convinced him to return to his master. This was a contradiction of what I believed God should have done. Philemon was a doctrinal pickle to me.

This doctrinal pickle returned during the last year when I kept hearing about the "1619 Project" and "The Great Sin and Shame of America." So, I decided to attempt to solve the dilemma of slavery, guilt, and Christianity.

The first thing I needed to do was define "slavery." The U. S. State Department has defined slavery as any kind of sex trafficking, forced labor, debt bondage/bonded labor, domestic servitude, or forced child labor. The scripture has less categories but indi-

cates that slaves do forced labor, have lost their freedom, and have no rights. Satisfied with the definitions I decided to start at the beginning: Slavery in the ancient world. After the ancient world I would look at slavery during New Testament times, the Middle Ages, and the Renaissance. Then I would examine slavery in the Americas, and modern times. Finally, I wanted to solve the Philemon Pickle.

The reasons for slavery have remained consistent throughout history. People became slaves because of debt, committing a crime, captured during war, and being born to slaves. The interesting thing to me was that slavery was NOT limited to certain races or nationalities.

Next week we will look at slavery in the ancient world, Old Testament, and New Testament.
