Spiritual gifts

1 Cor 12:4-11

⁴ There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit is the source of them all. ⁵ There are different kinds of service, but we serve the same Lord. ⁶ God works in different ways, but it is the same God who does the work in all of us.

⁷ A spiritual gift is given to each of us so we can help each other. ⁸ To one person the Spirit gives the ability to give wise advice^[b]; to another the same Spirit gives a message of special knowledge.^{[c] 9} The same Spirit gives great faith to another, and to someone else the one Spirit gives the gift of healing. ¹⁰ He gives one person the power to perform miracles, and another the ability to prophesy. He gives someone else the ability to discern whether a message is from the Spirit of God or from another spirit. Still another person is given the ability to speak in unknown languages,^[d] while another is given the ability to interpret what is being said. ¹¹ It is the one and only Spirit who distributes all these gifts. He alone decides which gift each person should have.

A few years ago, while studying about spiritual gifts a web-site was provided that includes a survey. After completing the survey, the results show you what your spiritual gifts may be. The results include some information to help you understand and act on your gifts also.

If, like me, you've heard about spiritual gifts your whole life, but perhaps have never felt you actually knew what your gift was—even though we are assured that each of us has one—you might find it interesting and maybe even reassuring to take the survey and review the results. You might find that what you've been doing all along is your 'gift', or you might be spurred to do something new.

Slavery in the Ancient World and Old Testament

The experience of losing his freedom was so bitter to my great great grandfather and his family that four of his sons joined the Union Army during the Civil War. At the same time as I was digesting the familial experience I was scouring for information in the Bible and historic records concerning slavery, so that I could understand why and when humanity created this horrific practice. As I followed the trail, I gained a fuller understanding of this scourge on humanity that was alarming.

In ancient times slavery was the destination for people who caused a predicament for society. Really, what do you do with criminals when there are no prisons? Or what do you do with people who are in debt? Do you allow prisoners taken in war to roam through the streets unmonitored? Should they have separated children from their parents if the parents were slaves. The answer to the dilemmas was slavery.

Though there was slavery throughout the ancient world there was no consistent attitude concerning slavery. In Egypt, the lives of some slaves were better than regular peasants. In Greece, Aristotle stated, "all non-Greeks are slaves by birth." But, at the same time it was against the law to strike a slave in Athens. The slaves in the Roman Empire numbered between 1 and 6 million. Rome had slaves from Germany, Greece, Spain, England, Palestine, Parthia, and North Africa. <u>The bright spot of freedom in the ancient world was in Persia where Cyrus the Great out-lawed slavery for all except those captured in war.</u>

The idea of slavery is introduced in the Old Testament in Genesis 9:25, where Noah awakens from his drunken stupor after his family exits the ark. Examples of a slave's life in the Old Testament would include Hagar a handmaid (slave) of Sarai (Genesis 16), the Israelites in Egypt (Exodus 5), and the Canaanites during Solomon's reign (1 Kings 9:21).

The Books of Law makes allowances for slavery. Israelites could buy foreign slaves (Lev. 25:54). People captured during war could be forced into slavery (Num. 31:9). Those unable to pay their debts could offer themselves as slaves (Ex. 21:2-6). If a thief could not make restitution he could be sold as a slave. A child born to slaves became a slave (Gen. 15:3). In 1 Kings 4:1-7, we find that children could be taken as slaves if

parents could not pay their debts.

The Old Testament did address the treatment of slaves. Israelite slaves were not to be treated harshly (Lev. 25:39-41), and certain injuries done to a slave by his master would result in the slave's freedom (Ex. 21:26-27).

The Old Testament also allowed slaves to gain their freedom (Lev.25). In fact, according to the law no Hebrew could be a permanent slave to another Hebrew. A slave was given their freedom after 6 years of service, and during the Year of Jubilee lands were to be restored and freedom given to all Hebrew slaves (Lev. 25). If, however, an individual wished to remain a slave God made a provision for that (Ex. 21:5-6).
