THE 7 LAST DAYS OF JESUS' LIFE

Thursday

Day 6 in the series

Holidays are especially nice when you are not cooking. I remember riding in our family car to my grandmother's ranch in southeastern Colorado every Thanksgiving. Mom and Dad were in the front with the baby while the remaining four siblings jockeyed for position in the back. I remember cars seemed to be more spacious back then and freedom of movement wasn't hampered by seatbelts. I'm sure it was a faster and easier trip than Jesus' trip from Jericho to Jerusalem the previous Saturday. His trip from Bethany to Jerusalem on Thursday was much faster. It probably only took about 20 minutes.

To begin with, let me remind you of the earlier explanation of the Jewish day. The Jewish day began at sundown. So, the Passover Feast (Seder) was held on our Thursday evening.

In Jesus' day Passover was one of three feasts that Jews were required to celebrate in Jerusalem. Josephus indicates that during one Passover the population of Jerusalem increased to 2,500,000 people. I find this difficult to fathom since the population of Fort Worth is close to 960,000. Let me explain. The area of Fort Worth is 350 square miles while Jerusalem had 1 square mile. Even if one counts the towns within walking distance of Jerusalem it would still be difficult to accommodate that many people. However, at that time people used lots of tents. Whether Josephus' number was inflated or not isn't the point. The point is that on Passover Jerusalem was very crowded.

Once again, I will not bring out the spiritual implications of these passages because John alone devotes over five chapters to this five or six hour period. Instead, I will try to put some order to the gospel accounts.

It was probably on Thursday morning that Jesus sent Peter and John (Luke 22:8) to find and prepare the Passover Seder (meal). Most scholars agree this happened in the house of Mary, John Marks's mother (Acts 12:12).

Sometime around 7:30 PM Jesus and the disciples arrived to celebrate the Passover which can't begin until around 8:00 PM, which is

sundown. The Seder can last from thirty minutes to all night. Obviously, this one would not take all night.

After the Passover Seder started John recorded that Jesus got up and washed the disciples’ feet. When this was accomplished, he returned to his place and predicted that one of them would betray him. It was at this point that Jesus indicated to John that the betrayer was Judas. It is odd that the disciples didn’t understand (John 13:28-30). Judas left.

For some reason the disciples started arguing about who would be greatest, which is something one would expect at a barroom instead of the Last Supper. Jesus, however, ended the arguing quickly by pointing out that the greatest would be the one who served. He had just illustrated this when he washed their feet. Just as soon as the arguing died down Jesus informed Peter that he would deny Jesus three times before the rooster crowed the next morning.

It is at this juncture that Jesus institutes what we know as the Lord’s Supper. Some of the symbolic food and rituals of the Passover Seder are incorporated into the Lord’s Supper. But it occurred at the end of the Seder.

John used three chapters to describe Jesus’ lessons that came next (John 14-17). Here Jesus answered Thomas’, Philip’s, and Judas’ (not Iscariot) questions about where he was going and what was going to happen. There are also the teachings about the vine and branches, opposition from the world, the coming of the Holy Spirit, the disciple’s future joy over the resurrection, and the promise of peace and answered prayer. Finally, Jesus prayed for the disciples and all believers.

After this Matthew and Mark recorded that they sang a hymn. This signaled the end of the Passover Seder.

Jesus then took the disciples to Gethsemane. I don’t know how big the group was but there may have been more disciples than those who were apostles. It was probably on the way that he reminded Peter that he would deny Jesus three times. When they arrived Jesus took Peter, James, and John a distance from the rest of the group. It was here, at this time, that John recorded that Jesus’ “sweat became like

drops of blood” while the apostles slept.

When Jesus was praying to God to remove the “cup from me,” Judas appeared with a large contingent of religious leaders and a Roman cohort. How big the Roman cohort was is unknown. A full cohort was about six hundred soldiers, but this was probably less.

During the arrest, Judas identified Jesus with a kiss. John lets us know that when Jesus admitted who he was the arresting crowd “drew back and fell to the ground.” He also lets us know that Peter drew a sword and cut off Malchus’ ear (the high priest’s slave), but that Jesus healed him and told Peter to put away the sword. After this they bound Jesus and took him to the house of Annas. Two apostles follow. They were John, who gives his eyewitness account of the trials and crucifixion, and Peter. John was acquainted with the high priest, which is highly unlikely for the average Jew. We learn that John’s family had servants in Mark 1:20. So, the family of Zebedee was probably wealthy and had influence. The other individual who followed is unnamed. His account is found in Mark 14:51-52. It tells us that when most of the apostles fled a certain individual who was only wearing a sheet was grabbed by the arresting group. He escaped by running out of his clothes. He left the scene naked. Scholars agree that the individual was John Mark.

So, around midnight or soon after most of the apostles were on the run. Peter was standing outside the gate at house of Annas, while Jesus was being questioned and John watched.
