Sermon Text: 1 Samuel 16 & 17

Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1-2 & 8-13

What is in the Heart

CARING FOR ONE ANOTHER

As you go, preach this message: 'The kingdom of heaven is near'. Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received, freely give." Matt. 10:7-8

Jesus gave those instructions to His apostles sending them out with the news about the coming kingdom. They were to bless the people through the powers they received. Later, when the apostles returned from their going from place to place, they reported how they had touched the lives of many people. Jesus taught His disciples to show compassion. Many Scriptures record the compassionate acts of Jesus, and the apostle John says that there were so much more that was not written down.

The nature of the Lord Jesus Christ doesn't fit well in our culture today. Contemporary America isn't set up to promote mutuality, care, or common life. Rather it is designed to maximize individual accomplishment. Perhaps we can attribute the breakdown of human relationships today to this self-centered approach to living. Then, there is also the lack of value for human life. The explosion of events that take human life is evidence that people do not care about other people. This is what has happened: people love things and use people instead of using things and loving people.

While Jesus was busy in His ministry work, He stopped to heal the blind man. When Jesus saw the widow walking to the grave of her only son, He stopped and raised her son to life. The ten lepers cried out for help and Jesus cleansed them. When the crowds were tired and hungry, Jesus fed them with the fish and bread. The penitent thief dying on a cross next to Jesus pleaded for mercy. Jesus gave the dying man the grace he needed.

Jesus has called His followers to live in a community of faith. The church is God's family where the saved share in a common faith and love. Helping one another shows the compassion of Christ. It is a community thing, not an individual accomplishment.
