COMMONSENSE FAITH

"One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, He was being carefully watched. There in front of Him was a man suffering from dropsy. Jesus asked, 'Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath or not?' But they remained silent. So taking hold of the man, He healed him and sent him away. Then Jesus asked them, 'If one of you has a son or an ox that falls into a well on the Sabbath day, will you not immediately pull him out?' And they had nothing to say." Luke 14:1-6

Several recorded scenes in Christ's ministry address this subject of healing on the Sabbath. Jesus and His disciples were often questioned and accused of breaking the Sabbath Day Laws. The problem as is stated elsewhere in the Gospel was the traditions that had been passed down. Jesus taught: "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath." (Mark 2:27) God intended by making the Sabbath Day holy was to bless mankind. The Pharisees of Jesus day had made such traditional rulings and rabbinic interpretations of the law that burdens were placed upon the people rather than the blessings.

Our religious practices should always honor God's Will. Jesus teaches us to use common sense in applying the Will of God. The parable of the 'Good Samaritan' that Jesus shared with a teacher of the law. recorded in (Luke 10) tells of religious folks (a Priest & Levite) who ignored the wounded man in the ditch. The man needed help. These two religious leaders and servants of the Lord failed to obey the second most important command found in the Law of Moses, "Love your neighbor as yourself." (Lev. 19:18, Mark 12:31) But the Samaritan who came along stopped and rendered aid. This foreigner hated and despised by Jews because of national, racial and spiritual distinctions did God's will. He kept the law of God. The Lord instructed this teacher to, "Go and do likewise".

A commonsense faith is one that honors the teachings of Christ and makes its application appropriate to meet the needs of mankind. Hate sin! But love the sinner. Sinners need saving, not condemnation. (Luke 15).
