Servanthood

"....so he (Jesus) got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him......when he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. 'Do you understand what I have done for you? You call me Teacher and Lord, and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you'." John 13:4-5, 12-15

The 'Last Supper' is packed full of the Lord teaching his disciples. His words and actions remain recorded for us today. Each Lord's Day we include the eating of the bread and drinking from the cup to remember our Lord and his suffering in our place. What he shared that night before he was betrayed and arrested still leads us in our spiritual exercises. When our sharing in communion is done in reverence to the Lord's holy gift upon the cross, we bow humbly before our Creator and Redeemer.

The apostle John gives us the scene of the Lord washing the feet of his disciples. What an important moment in the life of the apostles. Oh, how important those moments are for us! Jesus has called us through an unforgettable example to be like him. We are to have a servant's heart. Being a disciple of Jesus is not about position, it is about ministry. This is what he teaches us so we can fill our calling and place in the church.


