When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired men have food to spare, and here I am starving to death! I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me like one of your hired men.' So he got up and went to his father."

Luke 15:17-20

The old church hymn used as a song of invitation was written with these verses in mind.

"I am resolved no longer to linger, charmed by the world's delight; things that are higher, things that are nobler, these have allured my sight. I am resolved to go to the Savior, leaving my sin and strife; He is the true One, He is the just One, he has the words of life. I am resolved to follow the Savior, faithful and true each day, heed what he sayeth, do what He willeth, He is the living way. I am resolved to enter the kingdom, leaving the paths of sin; friends may oppose me, foes may beset me, still will I enter in."

Thinking about the change of heart in the prodigal son, the song invites us to make the same resolve as did this wayward son.

To resolve is to decide firmly on a course of action. It is that time of the calendar year that has us thinking 'New Year Resolutions'. Following the holiday festivities often the resolve is to lose those unwanted pounds by diet and exercise. While that may be a healthy change, I would have us consider things in the spiritual realm.
