IN JOY AND IN SORROW

“In this world you will have tribulation, but be of good courage, I have overcome the world.”

“...They will lay hands on you and persecute you. They will deliver you to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors, and all on account of my name.”

“They called the apostles in and had them flogged. Then they warned them not to speak in the name of Jesus....The apostles left the Sanhedrin, rejoicing, because they had been counted worthy of suffering disgrace for the Name.”

Acts 5:40-41

Our grandson Jonathan and Joslynn (his bride to be) wanted to share traditional vows during the wedding ceremony. All of us who were in attendance heard Jonathan’s parental grandad ask them if they were willing to take one another “In joy and in sorrow” along with the other portions of their ‘I do’s’.

All of us know that there will always be good times and bad. The wisdom from ancient Scriptures: *“There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven:....a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance..”* *Eccl. 3:4* How very appropriate to remind a young couple entering a new relationship and beginning a new journey in life together that life will not be full of joy and happiness. They should be prepared to support one another during those struggles too.

The history of the church tells the tale of the immediate persecution experienced by Christ’s disciples. Acts of the Apostles is only the beginning of the persecutions against God’s people. Just as Jesus foretold: *“If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world.”* *John 15:18-19*

Just as the newly weds needed to be prepared and willing to join hands together and encounter the sorrows along with life’s joy, we too, should join together as God’s family to deal with the world’s hatred toward us. We cannot shrink back from witnessing our faith in the world. We are called to be His witnesses. By sharing our faith in worship and ministry we encourage each other; *“spurring one another toward love and good deeds.”* *Heb. 10:24*

“Remember those earlier days after you receive the light, when you stood your ground in a great contest in the face of suffering. Sometimes you were publicly exposed to insult and persecution; at other times you stood side by side with those who were so treated.....”

Heb. 10:32-33

Living by faith in Jesus our Lord gives us inexpressible joy. Living for Jesus in this sinful and perverse generation will create unwanted sorrows. Let us be faithful in joy and in sorrow.


