HOSPITALITY

*Fr*om the Lord's own words recorded in Matthew chapter 25 we have the scene explaining how there will be a separation between those who will and those who will not receive the inheritance of the eternal Kingdom:

"Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me."

The rest of the passage tells us about those who will not enter and were told they had not fed the hungry, provided clothing for the needy and failed to help those who were strangers, sick or in prison. The big question that came from both sides was when they saw the Lord in need and took care of him or had failed to do so. Jesus said, *"When you did (or not) do to the least of these brothers of mine."*

Often in the teaching Christ brought with Him from heaven there is found instruction to care one for another, give what we must care for the needy, show hospitality. I was reminded of this message this past week. We received a call for help by a man who identified himself as a pastor. He explained that the congregation is very small and very limited in resources, but during the bitter cold when the temperatures dropped so low, he and the group provided a warm place for three families. One family had children. For almost a week they had cared for their needs. Their space was limited but they purchased air mattresses. His request was to help him with his electric bill. His prepaid electric service was going to be turned off if he did not get funds to replenish the excess use. He said that his own family would not have heat.

Because of the generous giving from the membership we could and did provide for this man's urgent need for his family. They had shown the kind of care for those in need that the Lord spoke of and even sacrificed beyond what they were able to afford. Lots of shelters were opened to give protection from the severe weather. I do not know if there were no more room to be found, but I do know that these families found God's people practicing His will. Their hospitality provided a shelter and warm bed with meals.

I know virtually nothing about Charles and the group of believers or the folks they helped. I know that the Lord Jesus knows it all. I commend them in showing hospitality, honoring Jesus in a special way.

Passover



Exodus Chapter 12 identifies and defines the Passover as God laid out his plans for his people, in leading them out of Egypt.

According to online Brittanica— Passover commemorates the Hebrews' liberation from slavery in Egypt and the "passing over" of the forces of destruction,

or the sparing of the firstborn of the Israelites, when the Lord "smote the land of Egypt" on the eve of the Exodus. Passover begins with the 15th and ends with the 21st (or, outside of Israel and among Reform Jews, the 22nd) day of the month of Nisan (March or April).

The bible reveals many references to this major Jewish Festival of Unleavened Bread. Scriptures tell us why it was celebrated, who could and could not participate in the meal, what was to be included in the meal, where the meal was to be eaten and how long each yearly celebration was to last.

But have you ever had a Passover meal?

David Keller is planning a Passover meal on Friday, April 26. The intention is to get some idea about what the celebration included—it's about more than the food. A sign-up sheet is in the north foyer for anyone who would like to participate. A sign-up is necessary to know how much of certain foods will be needed.

More details will be provided as the event gets nearer.

Relationship between Easter and Passover dates:

There is much confusion regarding the relationship of the dates for Easter and Passover. Different calendars, different religious sects, lunar cycles—and more... many factors contribute to determining the date for both these celebrations. This year, we celebrate Easter is on Sunday, March 31, while Passover begins at Sundown on Monday, April 22.

As the officer cuffed the man to take him in, he asked the burglar, "Why did you just stand there? All the old lady did was yell a Scripture at you."


"Scripture?" replied the burglar. "She said she had an ax and two 38's!"


