# LORD OF THE SABBATH

Reading the Gospel accounts will reveal that many of the Jews were upset with Jesus. In particular the Pharisees had lots of objections to what Jesus did and allowed his disciples to do. One of the most notable objects was the breaking of the Sabbath. One record is found in Luke 6.

#### "One Sabbath Jesus was going through the grainfields, and his disciples began to pick some heads of grain, rub them in their hands and eat the kernels. Some of the Pharisees asked, Why are you doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath?"

There were laws in the Scriptures governing what could be done on the Sabbath. In the Old Testament law given to Israel by Moses the Sabbath was a day of rest. It was set aside from the other six days of the week. In Mark's Gospel account this same scene is recorded. Jesus said, *"The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. For the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath."* The record of both Luke and Mark continued with Jesus challenging their question toward him with him asking: *"Which is lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?"* They did not answer Jesus. Then the Lord stood a man with a shriveled hand before them, and he healed him. In Matthew the 12th chapter Jesus asked those Pharisees:

#### "If any of you has a sheep and it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will you not take hold of it and lift it out? How much more valuable is a man than a sheep! Therefore, it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath."

The same objection was made against Jesus because he healed a man who was paralyzed. He healed him and told him to take up his pallet and go home. It was on a Sabbath Day. Those Pharisee, watchdogs of the law of Moses had misapplied God's command to *"Observe the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy".* 

That law was given to bless those who observed it as was true of all the laws the Lord imposed on his people. The laws given to guide us in following Jesus, the King of kings and the Lord of lords will bless everyone who observe them. How sad to know that those who were so judgmental of Jesus could not see the good he did or the miracles of healing, but rather devised plots to kill him.

The law of keeping the Sabbath, eating only clean meats and many others are not imposed upon us under the New Testament covenant. In keeping Christ's law we should become 'Good Samaritans' every day of the week.

## Passover



**Exodus Chapter 12** identifies and defines the Passover as God laid out his plans for his people, in leading them out of Egypt.

According to online Brittanica— Passover commemorates the Hebrews' liberation from slavery in Egypt and the "passing over" of the forces of destruction,

or the sparing of the firstborn of the Israelites, when the Lord "smote the land of Egypt" on the eve of the Exodus. Passover begins with the 15th and ends with the 21st (or, outside of Israel and among Reform Jews, the 22nd) day of the month of Nisan (March or April).

The bible reveals many references to this major Jewish Festival of Unleavened Bread. Scriptures tell us why it was celebrated, who could and could not participate in the meal, what symbolic foods were to be included in the meal, where the meal was to be eaten and how long each yearly celebration was to last.

But have you ever had a Passover meal?

David Keller is planning a Passover meal on Friday, April 26. The intention is to get some idea about what the celebration included—it's about more than the food. A sign-up sheet is in the north foyer for anyone who would like to participate. A sign-up is necessary to know how much of certain foods will be needed.

#### More details will be provided as the event gets nearer.

Relationship between Easter and Passover dates:

There is some confusion regarding the relationship of the dates for Easter and Passover. Different calendars, different religious sects, lunar cycles—and more... many factors contribute to determining the date for both these celebrations. This year, we celebrate Easter is on Sunday, March 31, while Passover begins at Sundown on Monday, April 22.

"Trading Your 'If Only' Regrets for God's 'What If' Possibilities"

Based on the first study session the men's group learned some things about regrets. In the short-term, considering Action vs Inaction: 53% to 47% felt that Action was the most important.

However, when considered long-term the view was 84% to 16% that Action was the most important.

Conclusion: **In the long term, we regret our inaction more than our action.** Do we try so hard to avoid doing something wrong that we don't have enough time to do anything right?
