## **"BE STILL AND KNOW THAT I AM GOD"**

#### **PSALMS 46:10**

Through the inspired pen of the Psalmist, we hear God's command to take time, to stop, to pause and to consider God. It is early in the calendar year, but I have already heard from two dear sisters in Christ whom I communicate with every month about the radio programs that the passage of time is racing so very fast the pace is unbelievable. How can we have spent the first month of the year? And now we are not far from Spring. (I did not burden them with the facts of aging, and how time changes speed, which I am sure they didn't need me to share.)

Obviously we live busy lifestyles. The State of Texas has cooperated with us in addressing our needs. They set the speed limits higher so we can get from one place to another quicker. The technology industry is doing their part. Every electronic gadget has a faster processor. I didn't live before telephones, electricity, or automobiles. These and other things that have added to a faster pace were already around before I came on the scene. But I recall my dad telling of his childhood when they traveled on foot, or by horse and carriage. My granddad had a difficult time changing over from the horse and buggy to a pickup. I have experienced the computer age and the advances in technology, and I have problems making some changes. I must ask my children and grandchildren often how to work my smart phone. If anything changes on my computer, it challenges me to use it. (Eric is on speed-dial) So, I can relate well to Grandpa's problem.

With all these developments, we use these things to free up time and space. But I am thinking and witnessing that the opposite is true. instead of helping free up time, seems they have created the need to spend more time using them and having less time for other things.

How easy is it for us to obey the command of this Scripture? It is a command. It is God speaking through the psalmist. He commands that we devote time to knowing Him and His majesty. Nothing in all our day is more important. Have you been still today? Do you have a quiet time? Does it include meditation upon the Heavenly Father? Who he is? If so, then we will know the truth from where the Psalmist began: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." Psalms 46:1

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## Passover

**Exodus Chapter 12** identifies and defines the Passover as God laid out his plans for his people, in leading them out of Egypt.

The bible reveals many references to this major Jewish Festival of Unleavened Bread. Scriptures tell us why it was celebrated, who could and could not participate in the meal, what symbolic foods were to be included in

the meal, where the meal was to be eaten and how long each yearly celebration was to last.

According to Multi Faith Neighbors Network (mfnn.org) :

The celebration of Passover includes a seder, a festive and ritual meal that incorporates the retelling of the Israelites' exodus from Egypt. In addition, Jews abstain from eating "chametz" (chametz is leavened bread) and other leavened food. As the Israelites fled Egypt, they baked bread but left so quickly that they did not have time to allow the bread to rise. Instead, they baked flat, cracker-like food known as "matzah." Many Jews get rid of every trace of "chametz" in their home prior to the start of Passover.

But have you ever had a Passover meal?

David Keller is planning a Passover meal on Friday, April 26. The intention is to get some idea about what the celebration included—it's about more than the food. A sign-up sheet is in the north foyer for anyone who would like to participate. A sign-up is necessary to know how much of certain foods will be needed.

#### More details will be provided as the event gets nearer.

If you are interested in simple "facts" about Passover and the associated celebrations and traditions, as well as how the date for the celebration is determined, there is much information online. All you have to do is "Google" your questions regarding Passover and many options for answers to your question will be shown.

"Trading Your 'If Only' Regrets for God's 'What If' Possibilities"

Based on the first study session the men's group learned some things about regrets. In the short-term, considering Action vs Inaction: 53% to 47% felt that Action was the most important.

However, when considered long-term the view was 84% to 16% that Action was the most important.

Conclusion: **In the long term, we regret our inaction more than our action.** Do we try so hard to avoid doing something wrong that we don't have enough time to do anything right?
