Love Your Enemies/Pray for Them

"You have heard that it was said, 'love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be sons of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your brothers, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect." Matt. 5:43-48

What a high standard Jesus sets for his disciples! If we set foot on the pathway of following Jesus as Lord, we find ourselves challenged to live far above normal human emotions and responses. To walk with Jesus is to accept the high calling of divine love. God so loves us and in turn we then demonstrate his love in word and deed. When we use the word perfect, we usually mean without any flaw. The true meaning of the Greek word *Teleios* in this passage is being mature, whole, or complete. Since it is beyond our flesh to be without sin, we cannot be like God in this way. However, the Father has set the pattern. Jesus refers to the Father's care for both the good and evil, the righteous and unrighteous. We are charged to be like him in our care for others. If we are going to be like our heavenly Father, our care for others must reach out beyond our loved ones. It means we seek good for others, even when they do not have that same desire for us.

When God sent Jesus into this world to save us by dying upon the Cross, every human being was God's enemy. (Rom. 3:23--- "All have sinned..." Rom. 5:6--- "Christ died for the ungodly".... Rom. 5:8--- "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us"....Rom. 5:10--- "When we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to Him through the death of His Son...") Since God does not make distinctions when he sends the sun and rain upon the earth, we must be like Him in our blessing others around us. One very possible way that we can show this kind of care is by offering prayers on behalf of those who are our enemies. In some cases that may be the only way to show the same kind of care that our heavenly Father does.

It isn't surprising that it was said of Jesus that he went about doing good. Treating others who may be mistreating us the way Jesus did, can only be considered good.

"He has shown you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly, and to love mercy and to walk humble with your God." Micah 6:8



Current Study: <u>If</u> by Mark Batterson. "Trading Your '**If Only**' Regrets for God's '**What If**' Possibilities"

Most recently we looked at Matthew 18:23-24, 35. It is about a man who owed 10,000 talents. Mark Batterson provided this comparison with the currency exchange of today:

Mina = 3 months wages Talent = 60 minas [or 180 months

(15 yrs) wages]

10,000 talents (what the man owed) = 150,000 years of wages 150,000 years in todays life expectancy would be 2,232 lifetimes

Minimum wage today = \$7.25/hour Annual income = \$15,080.

Annual income x 150,000 years of wages = \$2,262,000,000.00 (That's $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$ illions)

The take-away: This is your value to God in today's currency.
