

ON THE JERICHO ROAD

Luke 10:25-37

I wonder how well traveled the road from Jerusalem to Jericho might have been in the time of Christ?

Obviously, it was familiar to many. It would have been a very difficult journey going up to Jerusalem from Jericho. In the 17-mile hike one would ascend about 3300 feet in altitude. On the journey from Jerusalem the descent would be much less stressful. However, the description of the road conditions of that day indicates that rocks, ravines, and caves were along the path. This gave excellent hiding places for thieves. Since Jesus used a priest and Levite making the journey from Jerusalem down to Jericho it was common for them to live there.

I do not doubt that the lawyer who asked Jesus the question, "Who is my neighbor?" would have been knowledgeable about the dangers along that road. What he did not know was that Jesus took him down that pathway to teach him how to obey the Law. Since Jews and Samaritans had been at odds with each other for centuries, the parable would have struck a nerve. Jesus intended for the contrast to be of such a nature that the lawyer would be unable to miss his answer.

The priest and the Levite both saw the condition of the man robbed, beaten, and wounded. According to the law (and the lawyer would have known this) if a neighbor's ox or donkey was lost or hurt help should have been given. How much more if it were a person in need? They both left the man to bleed and perhaps die by walking on the other side of the road. Loving one's neighbor cannot be seen in their actions. But on that road came the Samaritan. He stopped and helped the Jewish man in the ditch. His sacrifice of time, care and resources to help the man showed the kind of "Love your neighbor as yourself" that God commanded.

We might be on the Jericho Road any day at any time. Not literally traveling from Jerusalem to Jericho, but figuratively we travel down life's road and opportunities to help someone may present itself to us. Jesus set before us the two most important commandments. In them the whole law of God rests. The first is to love God with our whole being and the second is to love our neighbors. The Samaritan kept the Lord's 'golden rule'. He treated another just like he would want to be treated. Let us keep in mind how we can use the resources God has given us to help someone out of a ditch. All it takes is compassion.


Friday, May 10 5:30-7:30 pm Melva Campbell Park
