Scripture Reading: Colossians 3:23-24



Lesson: Does God Have a Specific Will For Us?

ABBA FATHER

Unlike the relationship made through the law of Moses, Christ has brought us into a closer and better relationship with God. Scripture tells us plainly that we have a better covenant with better promises. The apostle Paul explains that through Christ Jesus and His sacrifice we have been adopted as children, receiving the grand inheritance of spiritual freedom. Romans 8:14-16, "Those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. And by Him we cry Abba, Father. The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children."

Jesus taught us to pray: "Our Father, in heaven,...." which emphasizes the requests of children seeking the father's blessing. The parable of the prodigal son returning home to the father after wasting time and resources by following the worldly desires, pleads for mercy from his father. It was his father's character that brought him back home.

Not everyone born in this world has the kind of father that bonds with his children, but many of us have known the love and care from our earthly fathers. How blessed to have the strong, yet tender hands of a father who "brings us up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord".

Today we recognize the great value of those fathers who exemplify the heavenly father. It may only be memories we have of our earthly fathers, but if they, like the heavenly father, loved us, we remember the tender mercies that were shown to us. Our prayer is that children will come to call upon their heavenly father because 'dad' has loved them.



Current Study: Personal testimonies of faith— "Aha" moments to share and how those moments tested and strengthened our Christian walk.


