<u>Marriage—Created by God</u>

"But for Adam no suitable helper was found. So the Lord God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep; and while he was sleeping, he took one of man's ribs and closed up the place with flesh. Then the Lord God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of man, and he brought her to the man.

The man said, 'This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called woman, for she was taken out of man.' For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and they will become one flesh. The man and his wife were both naked, and they felt no shame"

I listened to a discussion addressing broken relationships. Primarily it was about how children and parents had become estranged from each other. Various reasons why this is escalating in our culture today compared to years gone by. There was some speculation as to what all was contributing to this current trend. The messages from the use of social media were suspect. The liberal views being taught and promoted by university professors were given a place in changing young minds to turn away from what they had experienced in their upbringing. Some discussion was given to toxic parenting. It happens, far too often, I am afraid. It was a healthy discussion. Suggestions were made to help break down whatever barriers had come about. Keeping the door open and letting that be known is essential.

I agreed wholeheartedly that the nuclear family is under attack. It has been for years and the result of its breakdown is being seen more vividly today. Maybe I missed it, for I didn't hear everything shared in the discussion, but I didn't hear much about the basis of the family as God designed it. God created the family setting because man was alone. His social needs were not met. God ordained marriage between man and woman for the purpose of supplying relations in humanity

The departure from God's design, the lack of Biblical teaching, acceptance and application, in my opinion, is the most obvious reason behind the breakdown of marriages, the separation in family relationships and lack of respect and communication. God has set the moral truths before us. Having His standards unifies us. Ignoring the basic values leads to failures.


