THE PLOT TO KILL JESUS

"Jesus called out in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out!' The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face. Jesus said to them, 'Take off the grave clothes and let him go.' Therefore, many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary, and had seen what Jesus did, put their faith in him. But some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done. Then the chief priest and the Pharisees called a meeting of the Sanhedrin. "What are we accomplishing? They asked. Here is this man performing many miraculous signs. If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and then the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation." John 11:43-48

There was a great division among the Jewish people. Many came to believe in Jesus. Others rejected Him and His teachings. They rejected His claim to be the Messiah. In our text the Jewish religious leaders were afraid of losing their position among the people because of Jesus. They began to plot his death. And Jesus began to seclude Himself from public places until it was time for Him to go to Jerusalem, observe the Passover and then face His accusers.

I am amazed each time I hear the statement made by the Pharisees, chief priests and the members of the Sanhedrin: "If we let Him go on like this,....". Jesus had just raised His friend Lazarus from the dead after he had been in the grave four days. Jesus had healed the lepers, opened the eyes of the blind, healed the lame, deaf and mute. What in comparison would these men do? Nothing at all! Yet, they had the audacity to think they could stop Him. They discounted all His powers demonstrated through miracles.

I am sure when Jesus gave Himself over to be crucified, they thought they had silenced Him by their cunning and deceptive ways. They had only contributed to accomplish God's plan of salvation through the death, burial and resurrection of His Son, Jesus. When the tomb was found empty, they did all they could to deny that He had risen. Denial, denial, denial! We did not see the empty tomb. We have not been among those who came face to face with the Lord. His miracles were witnessed by others who have testified to us. Still, we believe.

"Jesus said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe.' Thomas said to Him, 'My Lord and my God'. Then Jesus told him, 'Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." John 20:27-29


