SUFFERING CHRISTIANS

"DO NOT REPAY EVIL WITH EVIL, INSULT WITH INSULT, BUT WITH BLESSING, BECAUSE YOU WERE CALLED SO THAT YOU MAY INHERIT A BLESSING."

I PETER 3:9

Jesus foretold of troubles in this world for all who follow him. Discipleship was never presented as a wonderful gift with no problems, no rejections, no losses. The opposite is evident. Many passages from the Lord's own words and from the pens of inspired men tell of sorrows, suffering and hardships that came upon the Christians of that day. Reading through the history of Christianity tells of suffering and persecution that has taken place on God's people. God's people have suffered much.

Sometimes I must try and place myself outside of my own lifetime. Living in a country that protects me from religious persecution has kept me from suffering while in other places my brothers and sisters in the Lord have suffered and died because they live by faith. If for no other reason, and there are other reasons, we need to keep the Declaration of Independence governing us; this is it! It says that just because I live by faith, no one can persecute me for it. Take that away and our nation will follow the path of other places where people are killed because they believe.

What helps the most in keeping me aware of suffering for Christ is coming together before the Heavenly Father and praying over the elements of the Lord's Supper. Each week my mind is set on Calvary. The Cross stands tall with my savior battered, bruised, beaten, weakened, broken and bleeding. Sharing in the memory by breaking the bread and drink from the cup of the new covenant, I reflect on how much suffering the Lord did to provide salvation for me and all sinners who have faith in him. I need the reminder. Being protected from suffering, communion draws me back to the reality that most Christians have suffered for their faith.

"Do not be surprised at the painful trial you are suffering, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice that you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed. So then, those who suffer according to God's will, should commit themselves to their faithful Creator and continue to do good." I Peter 4:12-13






