LIVING IN A TROUBLING WORLD

"In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." John 16:33

Jesus spoke truth when he shared those words with his chosen disciples. Immediately after saying this to them, he bowed before the Father in heaven and prayed those men. We are included in the Lord's prayer as well. He prayed for us who would not walk with him on earth but would follow in his footsteps by faith. Jesus had walked on this earth and he knew well the kind of hostility, deception and hatred of men. He knew that he would be sending these men out into the world to share the Good News. He asked the Father to protect them. Living for Jesus, standing up for Jesus in a world that rejects the Lord and his moral teachings is a difficult task. We need the Father's protective care over us.

I am so thankful that we have the recorded prayer of Jesus asking our heavenly Father to shelter us from the evil one. Satan and all his followers attack the truth and anyone who stands upon it. The hymn helps us keep our vision clear. It says this world is not our home we are just passing through. That echoes the Word of God when it reminds us that our citizenship is in heaven.

Much of the hostility, anger, rage and division within our nation is there because some of us are holding up the Bible as the authority on right and wrong. Others are doing everything to destroy its influence upon our part of the world. The rejection of God's goodness and righteousness spread upon the hearts of men show the results. The old prophet Jeremiah spoke well: "I know, O Lord, that a man's life is not his own; it is not for man to direct his own steps." Jer. 10:23 From the days of Cain and Abel to this very day, mankind needs God's guidance to prevent the evil one's success. We have the word of Truth. It doesn't mean we will not face trouble, but we have the promise of God that he will never forsake us. I love to remind us:

"We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.... If God is for us, who can be against us?... Shall trouble or hardship or persecution of famine or nakedness or danger or sword?... No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that




