CONVICTIONS

I often hear the statement that we must get back to our 'core values'. It is said by those who believe in God and the influence of His Word upon our nation. I am with them in this calling to return to values that helped to form the ideals derived from 'all men are created equal'. I really like to stress the fact that our founding fathers were men who believed in the fact that we have been created.

My core values have been shaped by the Creator who was introduced to me in my youth. The values were found in the Bible, where the Creator spoke, wrote and commanded the moral values that should be found within me. I am thankful for that influence.

I have been reading a booklet written to help churches hold on to the core values that are found in God's Word. There is some good teaching about the need for the church and for individual Christians to stand firm upon the convictions that give us our values. The fact is there are groups and individuals who, because of cultural changes are adopting lifestyles that contradict the moral code found in the Bible. We live in a world that is demanding an acceptance of such things that God condemns.

When the apostles were warned and threatened to never speak in the name of Jesus, their response was:

"Judge for yourselves whether it is right in God's sight to obey you rather than God. For we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard." Acts 4:19-20

"We must obey God rather than men! The God of our Fathers raised Jesus from the dead---whom you have killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might give repentance and forgiveness of sins to Israel. We are witnesses of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him." Acts 5:29-32 They were men of deep convictions. The threat of death did not deter them from living by what God had revealed to them.

Our convictions must run deep in the Truths that come from Jesus. Our heavenly calling should shape what we can or cannot accept. Let us remember that our core values do not justify condemnation of anyone. They set the standard of what is right and wrong. We live by them. They come from God
