The message below was written by one of Joyce Bennett's older relatives (a cousin I believe) and read by Sadie Carson, another relative, at Joyce's graveside service on Tuesday. She was kind enough to share it for this memorial to our dear sister Joyce.

Joyce was a celebrity and destined for great things right from birth. She was born with two teeth. Her picture was published in the newspaper with two pearly white teeth in front and center of the bottom of her mouth.

She was by far the youngest of four siblings, but she always had the upper hand and used it often to her advantage.

Joyce along with her family had a strong work ethic. She left school at an early age to go to work with her sister Ethel at the FAA cafeteria where all the customers named her Little Bit.

Joyce married at the young age of 16 to Thomas Alvin Bennett Sr. Their marriage endured the test of time through sickness, health and happiness. She faithfully stood by his side and sat by his bedside during his last days with Alzheimer's.

She worked for Montgomery Wards on the seventh floor in packaging and shipping for over 30 years. This wasn't easy work. Standing on her feet all day, handling small and large packages, raising and lifting them over her head to reach the bins and shoots, a tall order for a 'short' person.

Her faith was important. She helped with the weekly church bulletin at the Westworth Church of Christ. She helped the ladies prepare meals for special occasions and formed loving and lasting friendships. When she moved into Eagle Crest Assisted Living in October 2023, to her surprise, she recognized several of the residents were from her church.

Joyce never wavered from her love for God and her family and countless friends. She leaves a legacy and a challenge for all of us to strive to be better, do better, live better and love better.
