Today's Lesson: What Does a Heart of Thanksgiving Lead to?

2 Chronicles 6:7-37

His Grace Lavished Upon Us

EPH. 1:3-8

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will---to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding."

The apostle Paul writes to our brothers who lived in Ephesus. They were among those this apostle had taught the Gospel and shared in ministry to spread the Good News to many. These beloved saints received this letter which included prayers and instruction for them as they lived and served Jesus. We read this letter of inspiration to find blessings for us today.

The above passage is the apostle's expression of praise for what God has done for us out of love. He has lavished grace upon us. In abundance God has showered us with something we do not deserve, have not earned, nor could purchase. Knowing that it was beyond our grasp, God has supplied every spiritual blessing for us to be sanctified in his sight. Since we could not be holy and would not be blameless before him, God set in motion the way and means for us to become righteous.

God ordained and planned these spiritual blessings before the creation of the world. Long before God breathed into the lump of clay the breath of life, God had determined to redeem us from our sins. I would hope and pray that we know and feel the heavenly blessings that rest upon all who by faith are among the chosen, predestined to live according to his will.
