MARY TREASURED ALL THESE THINGS IN HER HEART

Luke's account of the incarnation provides for us many details which we hang on to and usually spend time remembering, repeating and celebrating. From that moment when the angel Gabriel spoke his first words to Mary, *"Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."*, she heard the Lord's call. Yes, she was troubled and wondered about the blessing she received. Gabriel's message had just begun. The news from heaven was more than just an acknowledgement of how favored she was in God's sight. The announcement was a calling into a special service. God had chosen Mary to be the virgin who would give birth to the long-awaited Messiah.

We are thankful that the Gospel accounts unfold the whole script before us as God ordained the sending of his Son into the world. Mary was told how the Spirit of God would overshadow her. She would give birth to the Son of God. Her son would be the holy one. She gave birth to Jesus in a stable in Bethlehem. Shepherds came and praised God for his birth and what they had been told about the Savior. Forty days after giving birth Jesus was taken to the temple in Jerusalem in obedience to the law. The first born would be presented to the Lord. She heard all that Simeon and Anna had to say about her child and to her: "My eyes have seen your salvation...a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for the glory to your people Israel." Simeon prayed. Then to Mary he said, "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."

Jesus was twelve years old when he was with Joseph and Mary as they traveled to Jerusalem to observe the annual Passover feast. But he stayed behind and wasn't found among the group traveling home. When they found him, he had been amazing the teachers in the temple courts with his understanding and answers to their questions. Mary was worried about him, but his response was: "Why were you searching for me? Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?" Joseph and Mary did not understand. But at that time, the Word tells us: "His mother treasured all these things in her heart".

All of us who live by faith in Jesus the Christ get to treasure things in our hearts also. We hold dear the Truth of God's most precious gift. We celebrate with praise, as did the shepherds, the good news of great joy: *"In the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord."*
