From the Pulpit Today Speaker – Max Pratt

Lesson: Lazarus and the Rich Man

HE DID EVIL IN THE SIGHT OF THE LORD

"In the thirty-ninth year of Azariah king of Judah, Menahem son of Gadi became king of Israel, and he reigned in Samaria ten years. He did evil in the eyes of the Lord. During his entire reign he did not turn away from the sins of Jeroboam son of Nebat, which he had caused Israel to commit."

II Kings 15:16

I told Curtis after our study last Wednesday evening that I do not enjoy the study of some of Israel's history, and particularly the record of the divided kingdom. There is far too much violence. And way too many evil leaders. It makes for a very sad record of God's people. This time frame tells repeatedly that the kings did evil in God's sight. That was the norm. Israel had been led away into idolatry by Jeroboam. At the death of Solomon, the nation of Israel was split. Judah and Israel each had their king. The Northern tribes of Israel were led to worship the golden calves that Jeroboam set up and ordained a whole new order of sacrifices. This is what is referenced in the text. Jeroboam caused people to worship idols. The high places remained for generations. Successive kings continued to do evil.

The whole historical account of Israel and Judah is depressing. God had made such great and wonderful promises to his people. If only they had been faithful, the story would have been so much different. God was forsaken and idols were chosen. It began with Solomon who erected alters to the gods of his foreign wives. The spiritual adultery went on for centuries.

We are spiritual Israel. God has chosen us in His Son, Jesus. Jesus is our King, and we have been invited to share in the wonderful promises made in His name. If we are to learn anything from Israel's past, we must see their sin of unfaithfulness. The picture from Scripture is that Jesus is the bridegroom, and the church is His bride. We are to live faithfully to Him.

"Be faithful even to the point of death, and I will give you the crown of life." Rev. 2:10. That is the promise from Jesus. He spoke and John recorded his words. We live by faith and are certain of God's faithfulness in keeping His Word. To help us on our journey we have this instruction: "Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down He Did Evil in the Sight of the Lord (cont'd)

at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart." Heb 12:1-3

I pray we are writing a history of the Lord's church by following the Lord's will in our lives, turning away from any form of worship to an idol such as self-gratification, love of money, the praise of men.

"Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For everything in the world---the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does--- comes not from the Father but from the world. The world and its desires pass away, but the man who does the will of God lives forever." I John 2:15-17
