Judged by the Law that Gives Freedom

"Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he is blessed in his doing." James 1:22-24

A little later in James' practical Christian living letter we find him instructing us in this way: **"So speak and so act as those who are to be judged under the law of liberty." (Jas. 2:12)** A vital part of his letter is that of having the Word making a difference in who we are and how we live by our faith. Without the Word how would we know what we should and should not be doing. Among the New Testament writers, James does his part in leading us toward the Word of God so that we are under its influence. The Psalmist recorded that the laws, commands, precepts and statutes of the Lord were highly cherished to him because they provided heavenly guidance. James tells us that the wisdom from above is: **"pure, peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits"**.

I like the reference James gives to the Gospel message Jesus brought by calling it the "law of liberty" or the "law that gives freedom". The Old Law, the covenant God made with Israel, did not liberate anyone. It condemned people because no one who lived under it could fulfill it; until Jesus came along and lived without sin. The New covenant that Jesus inaugurated does indeed have the power to liberate man from his sin. Because the payment for sin has be made by the Lamb of God—Jesus.

Along with the Psalmist I pray, "Give me understanding, that I may keep your law and observe it with my whole heart. Lead me in the path of your commandments, for I delight in it." Ps.119:33-35 Then the benefit will be: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Ps. 119:105




