Judas and Betrayal

"Just as He was speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, appeared with swords and clubs, sent from the chief priests, the teachers of the law, and the elders. Now the betrayer had arranged a signal with them: 'The one I kiss is the man; arrest him and lead him away under guard.' Going at once to Jesus, Judas said, 'Rabbi!' and kissed him. The men seized Jesus and arrested him. Then one of those standing near drew his sword and struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his ear. Am I leading a rebellion, said Jesus, that you have come out with swords and clubs to capture me? Every day I was with you, teaching in the temple courts, and you did not arrest me. But the Scriptures must be fulfilled. Then everyone deserted him and fled."

Mark 14:43-50

Judas did not live long after his greedy betrayal of the Lord. Perhaps he believed that the Lord would simply walk away from their chains and swords. Maybe he thought that nothing can possibly harm Jesus. He had seen far too many miracles to believe otherwise. And maybe he gave it little thought. He had his own money purse now. Whatever his thoughts, it was not long before he knew his deed helped to lead Jesus to the Cross. He despised the money and tried to return it. Unsuccessful, he went out and hanged himself.

The fate of Judas carries a terrible sin. He wanted relief from his deed, but there was none to be found.

Betrayal has a very sad ending to it. Husbands and wives find misery because of betrayal. Friendship is forever broken by an act of betrayal. Business partners find it impossible to repair what a betrayal has done to their relationship.

Greed was behind Judas' betrayal of his innocent master. Lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes and the pride of life will bring about betrayal if it is allowed to run its course. Jesus came that we might overcome the power of sin and live above it.

Living a life filled with sin is a betrayal of the Lord Jesus. How can we live in such a way?

News Items

Read Any Good Books, Lately?

Let me present at least two for you to consider.

Others were probably aware, but I learned only last week of the published works of John Lisle (Mike and Lanette's other son ©). John's success as a published author of non-fiction has actually been going on for a few years already.

His book: The Dirty Tricks Department: Stanley Lovell, the OSS, and the Masterminds of World War II Secret Warfare (published in Feb 2024) begins the story about a select group of secret scientists during WWII who were directed by US government officials to explore and develop "dirty tricks" for the OSS (the precursor to the CIA). The book is based on extensive archival research and personal interviews.

The most recent book: <u>Project Mind Control: Sidney Gottlieb, the CIA and the Tragedy of MKULTRA</u> (a 2025 release) picks up the story after WWII as the OSS morphed into the CIA. The "dirty tricks" continue with unwitting participants and torture-like experiments.


"John's book is based on thousands of pages of documents, including depositions uncovered in a long-buried lawsuit against the CIA. The Case never went to trial, but the words of MKULTRA's victims and it's perpetrators were found by Lisle preserved in documents donated to the Library of Congress after Gottlieb's death." Zach Freeman for "The Azle News".

As someone who likes history, I plan to read these intriguingsounding books.

Based on the newspaper article—posted on the hallway bulletin board—John has plans for future books, the next of which may be more of an adventure story.

It is always nice to celebrate success with brothers and sisters in Christ and I know Mike and Lanette enjoy seeing John's success.


The men's group is also almost done with the review of this book and will be deciding what to do next. All men are encouraged to join this regular study. Suggestions for the next study are welcomed.
