If It is The Lord's Will

Most of us know it was James who penned these inspired words in his short, but powerful letter written to the disciples of the first century. God preserved His good book to make certain you and I have what the Lord's brother wrote long ago. The letter shares some great teaching about living by our faith.

When we take God's Word seriously, we apply it to our daily life. James wrote to help us do God's Will for the day we have. He reminds us that we do not know what tomorrow will bring or even if there will be a tomorrow.

The older I get, the more calendars I have replaced on my walls, the look back at the years gone by are a constant thought about the brevity of life. So, the plans we make, as James says, should be surrounded by our prayerful thought, "If it is the Lord's will". For we do not know if we will live, and whether we can accomplish our plans for this year. If we include God in our plans, submitting to His will being done in our lives, we are not boasting about our future. We are placing our lives, plans and hopes for this life in God's hands. We acknowledge that he is in control of our numbered days.

James gives us a reminder that we do not know what will happen in the days ahead. I like what the apostle wrote, "Whether we live or die, we are the Lord's". Jesus set the example for us when he knelt in prayer seeking relief from the suffering of the cross, leaving his disciples behind, facing the shame and pain. He prayed, sharing his fleshly desires, but he said, "Not my will, but yours be done".






