REFLECTIONS

Recently I have been listening to John Jewell's sermons after the boys go to bed. I am learning from the intended lessons but have also come to realize that I didn't pay much attention to these messages when they were first presented.

I attempted to justify my lack of focus by thinking 'well you are wrangling two children while listening.' This justification caused embarrassment. We are all God's children. He 'wrangles' us daily. We always expect and appreciate God's full attention. It does not seem right to use caring for my children as an excuse to ignore my 'parent.' God.

I am reminded of Revelation 3:16 which states "So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spit you out of my mouth."

Hot for God is ideal. That is where you are fully engaged in worshiping Him. Being cold towards Christianity is second best. Even if you are arguing against God, you are at least actively engaging in thought regarding religion. This may eventually lead you to being hot.

Lukewarm is worst. Comfortably going through the motions without spiritual engagement leaves no room for growth. I have come to realize that this is where I have been for the last three years. I wonder if anyone else feels that way.

One thing I have noticed in listening to John's sermons is that he often apologizes for the length of time. He also indicates a desire to please us. This is <u>not</u> a reflection upon John, but upon us as a congregation. Preachers are a vessel of God. They should not be meant to feel torn between serving God or serving us. Though guidelines are necessary for running a business - are we being too presumptuous attempting to give time constraints and rules to God's message? And in doing so are we letting our lukewarmness prevent us from growing in our relationship with God? If you find that you are more focused on how long the sermon will be; what words will be used in invitation; or if John is performing to **our** standards, rather than the message itself - then maybe you are lukewarm. You too may be going through the motions of church as I have.

Self-reflection is never comfortable. Especially when that was not the lesson you anticipated learning. It is a true blessing though when you humble yourself to the necessity of a spiritual recharge. It may be just the thing you need to get back on track to being hot for God...and just in time for summer.
