Christian Education Part seven in a series The Puritans

In England the Puritan, who were influenced by John Calvin demanded that the Church of England halt its Roman Catholic practices and advocated for autonomous churches. They formed a loose alliance with the Scottish Presbyterians in the 1630s and became a major political force, but many Puritans wanting to avoid the coming political upheaval boarded ships and crossed the Atlantic. The Pilgrims landed at Plymouth in 1620 and in 1630 the Massachusetts Bay Colony was founded. Within 11 years 21,000 Puritans had made the trip across the Atlantic.

The Puritans believed Christian Education started in the home. Parents were required to maintain family religion. Every day the Bible was to be read and God worshiped. No child, servant, or apprentice was to be allowed to grow up without instruction in the scriptures, or taught to reverence God, His word and His Day. Puritans believed families were the nurseries of the church and state. They asserted that neither the church nor state could survive the demise of the family. The parental obligation to teach children the scriptures was enforced by law. If parents neglected to instruct the members of their family their children could be forcibly removed.

Puritans began to instruct their children in Biblical Truths at an early age. As soon as a child showed understanding the instruction started. Their practice for the first 3 years was to speak often with the child of good things, laying concept on concept, line by line, little by little, following the Mosaic command, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." Deuteronomy 6:4-7.

Those over three years of age were to be instructed more formally and systematically. Once a week the head of the family taught his children from a short catechism or book for instructing the young. These books were to be studied and memorized. Tests were given to monitor the child's progress. They followed the early church's belief that children were not only expected to remember what the books said, but to understand them as well.

The Puritans also established schools for older children, both boys and girls. Finally, they established institutions of higher learning like Harvard to prepare young men for the ministry. The success of this emphasis on Christian Education is attested to by the fact that at this period in history Puritans were the most literate group in the world. Also, the Puritans emphasis on the scripture paved the way for what became known as the "Restoration Movement."
